Life on the Vine—Pruned by the Word John 15:1-8



The symbol of the Vine is a powerful biblical picture of what the Lord means for our life with him to be.

- Jesus is the Heavenly Vine.
- We are his **branches**.
- The purpose of our living union with Christ is to bear fruit.
- The Father is our Vinedresser.

God prunes us by his word so that we may bear more fruit.



JOHN 15:1-8

- ¹ "I am the true vine, and my Father is the vinedresser. ² Every branch in me that does not bear fruit he takes away, and every branch that does bear fruit he prunes, that it may bear more fruit. ³ Already you are clean because of the word that I have spoken to you. . . .
- ⁸ By this my Father is glorified, that you bear much fruit and so prove to be my disciples."

1. God's word is the *most powerful* creative force in the universe.

Genesis 1:1-3

¹ In the beginning, God created the heavens and the earth. ² The earth was without form and void, and darkness was over the face of the deep. And the Spirit of God was hovering over the face of the waters. ³ And God said, "Let there be light," and there was light.



Psalm 33:6

⁶ By the word of the LORD the heavens were made, and by the breath of his mouth all their host.



When God speaks, he can create things whose size is measured in light-years.

- Traveling at 186,000 miles per second, a beam of light can circle the earth 448 times in one minute.
- A beam of light travels
 5,880,000,000,000 miles (5 trillion, 880 billion) miles in a year.
- That distance is what we call a Light-Year.


- According to the best estimates of astronomers there are at least 100 billion galaxies in the observable universe.
- The edge of the known universe is believed to be 46 billion light-years away.
- From here astronomers can detect quasars, high-energy sources of light just now reaching us. That light may emanate from the cores of still farther galaxies.

- On a clear night you can see about a thousand stars with the naked eye.
- Yet the known universe is billions of light years across and comprises billions of galaxies each containing billions of stars.



However vast the cosmos may really be, God created all of it in an instant of time simply by *speaking* the words "Let there be light."





The same God who spoke the universe into existence also speaks to us from the pages of the Bible.

The Bible is like no other book in the world.

 God's written word is alive. It unleashes the supernatural power of God into the lives of people who read it.

"The words that I have spoken to you are spirit and life."



You have been born again, not of perishable seed but of imperishable, through the living and abiding word of God.

Hebrews 4:12

¹² For the word of God is living and active, sharper than any two-edged sword, piercing to the division of soul and of spirit, of joints and of marrow, and discerning the thoughts and intentions of the heart.

- The word translated "active" in Hebrews 4:12 is energes, the root of our word "energy".
- The Greeks used this word to describe soldiers who are fit for active duty.






Active Land that is under cultivation and producing a crop.




• An active *mine* that is producing minerals.




 Active money or capital that is earning a return and not lying idle.



- Energes describes something that is active, useful, and effective.
- The term is not used of potential power, but of actual power.



- Other books inform and inspire.
- But when a Christian, indwelt by the Holy Spirit, reads his Bible with a believing heart and an obedient spirit, God's Word does a supernatural work that no other book can do.




 Read with a believing heart the Bible produces a holy love for God, for God's will, God's ways, and God's kingdom. God's word is the pruning knife that prunes or "cleans" the branches on his Heavenly Vine.

John 15:1–3

¹ "I am the true vine, and my Father is the vinedresser. ² Every branch in me that . . . does bear fruit he prunes, that it may bear more fruit. ³ Already you are clean because of the word that I have spoken to you. . . ."

- The verb for "prune" kathairo and the adjective "clean" katharos come from the same root.
- God cleans us by pruning us with his Word.



- Grape branches can grow very fast and very long (twelve to twenty feet).
- Wild vines are unproductive because they use up resources that could be channeled into making fruit.



• God prunes our lives with his Word, convicting us of sin and exposing things that cause us to be unfruitful.

Hebrews 4:12

¹² For the word of God is living and active, *sharper* than any two-edged sword, *piercing* to the division of soul and of spirit, of joints and of marrow, and *discerning the thoughts and intentions of the heart*.

WHO REALLY KNOWS YOU?

- Your husband or wife?
- Your best friend?
- But do they really know the real you?
- Do they know exactly what's going on in your innermost heart?

- Honestly, how often do you know what's really going on in your own heart?
- All of us suffer from some degree of spiritual blindness. And the biggest problem with spiritual blindness is that you are blind to your blindness.
- Well, God knows it all and his Word finds it all!



- God's word is like a *surgeon's scalpel*.
- It dissects our innermost thoughts and intents.
- It lays us *bare*.
- It *probes* our hearts.

• The Holy Spirit will use God's word like a surgeon's scalpel to cut out our spiritual tumors wherever it finds sin.

How does this work?

- Suppose one morning your Bible study takes you through Ephesians 4:32:
 Be kind to one another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, as God in Christ forgave you.
- Suppose that you have been holding a grudge against someone. That verse will judge your heart and convict you of your sin.

- Or suppose you are reading through Philippians 2:3-4:
 - ³ Do nothing from selfish ambition or conceit, but in humility count others more significant than yourselves. ⁴ Let each of you look not only to his own interests, but also to the interests of others.
- Suppose you realize that you've been wrapped up in yourself lately, looking after yourself at the expense of others.
- That verse will put you right.


- Humans have an unlimited capacity for rationalization.
- One of the ways Satan keeps us in our sins is by deceiving us into thinking that what we are doing is OK, or at least that it isn't as bad as it really is.
- And as long as you hide in the dark, your fatal attractions will have power over you.

But God *loves you too much* to let you *live* in the *dark*.

 God's Word judges our thoughts. It prunes and cleans us.



- When you turn on the lights in a dirty room it's not pretty.
- But you can't clean a dirty room in the dark.
- You have to turn on the lights.



 When God's Word finds its way into some mess in your life that needs to be changed, you will be pruned.

1. Have a systematic, daily Bible reading plan and use it.


